What is the NFESC BAA program?

The Naval Facilities Engineering Service Center (NFESC) Broad Agency Announcement (BAA) program is a streamlined and flexible contracting alternative. It tailors the BAA program authorized in the Federal Acquisition Regulation to identify a wide range of innovative environmental technologies and methodologies in the advanced development stage. These technologies and methodologies must be ready for field application with potential for full-scale implementation.

Technologies and methodologies must be able to solve environmental problems under one of the Navy's areas of concern:

- Pollution Prevention and Compliance
- Cleanup and Restoration

How do you know which technologies are available?

We can provide you with a "Book of Abstracts" or abstracts that pertain to your area of interest. Abstracts are available on the Internet through DENIX, a controlled-access Web site. Access will be provided to DoD personnel only. Contact NFESC for a password.

Who can use the BAA?

Any DoD activity that is interested in demonstrating a technology may use the BAA Program to fund a contract award.

How do vendors submit their technologies for consideration?

The BAA is periodically published in the Commerce Business Daily (CBD). The announcement is also available on the CBD Web site - CBDNet. Interested vendors must follow the requirements outlined in the BAA announcement.

What is required from the vendor?

Submittals must describe the merits and objectives of the vendor's approach. The abstract must address the evaluation criteria provided in the BAA. Interested vendors should submit a 3-page abstract, with up to 10 pages of supporting data attached, describing the proposed technology or methodology.

Abstracts are thoroughly evaluated by a Technical Evaluation Board of NFESC's scientists and engineers to select technologies and methodologies that have potential benefits to the Navy. The abstracts are evaluated in accordance with the criteria stated in the BAA. Abstracts will not be evaluated against each other since each may possess a unique technology with no common work statement. Abstracts evaluated as acceptable are available to all Navy and DoD users for application to their specific needs.


